New Features Update

Thank you for your interest in Nammo WebEditor 2006. The latest version of our award-winning Web authoring tool includes several new features that are designed to increase utility and convenience for both novice and experienced Web authors.

New and improved features of Nammo WebEditor 2006 include:

Quick Tag Editor

The Quick Tag Editor window lets you quickly edit the HTML code of selected content or insert new HTML code at the current location. To open the Quick Tag Editor window, press Ctrl+Q, or on the Edit menu, click Quick Tag Editor.

You can use the Quick Tag Editor in Insert HTML, Edit HTML, or Wrap HTML mode.

Drawing on an Image

In the Image Effect dialog box, you can easily add text to an image or draw lines, circles, and rectangles. You can also draw with a freehand pencil or brush.

XHTML

You can now save documents in fully standards-compliant XHTML format. Just select *XHTML files* as the file type in the Save As dialog box.

Blog Posting

You can directly post a document to your blog or manage existing posts. You can even download an existing post, edit it with the full power of Nammo WebEditor, and then reupload it to your blog. Currently, Nammo WebEditor 2006 supports Movable Type and Blogger.com blogs.

Visual Aids

When you work on a table, Nammo WebEditor now optionally shows the widths of the table and its cells in a bar at the top of the table.

When you click an image in Edit mode, its display size and its actual size are optionally displayed below the image.

Layers now have title bars that display the layer name, its size, and its alignment.

Calculating Values in a Table

Namo WebEditor 2006 can calculate a value based on numbers in table cells and then insert the result in another cell. The following calculations are available:

- ✓ Sum
- ✓ Average
- ✓ Maximum
- ✓ Minimum
- ✓ Number of cells
- ✓ Number of non-empty cells
- ✓ Variation
- ✓ Standard deviation

Tracing Image

You can place a tracing image "under" a document and use it to help lay out the document. A tracing image is invisible in browsers. You can specify tracing image settings in the Document Properties dialog box.

Photo Album

With the redesigned Photo Album Wizard, you can now save your settings when you create a photo album and then reuse them when you create another.

The Photo Album Wizard has also been improved to offer a more user-friendly process.

Tag Selector

When you select the Preview option, the Tag Selector now displays tags formatted the way their content actually appears, including such attributes as color, font, border, etc.

Also, the Tag Selector's right-click menu now includes more commands, including commands to open the Quick Tag Editor for a specific tag, quickly open the Style dialog box for more tag types, and open the HTML Reference directly to the appropriate page for a tag.

CSS

Namo WebEditor 2006 has much-improved tools for using Cascading Style Sheets. Here's a list of the most important changes:

- ✓ With some exceptions, the Formatting panel now lists all the styles (CSS classes) that are applicable to the selected element, not just those that are applicable to the current paragraph.
- ✓ The style list of the Styles dialog box can now lists styles from an external style sheet linked to the current document, not just from the document's internal style sheet. You can edit external styles just like internal ones, and Nammo WebEditor will save the changes to the external style sheet.
- ✓ The Class/ID dialog box now lets you choose a class from a list of classes for which styles have been defined in all style sheets.
- ✓ You can reorder style sheets in the External Style Sheets dialog box to change their order of precedence. The style sheet list now includes the document's internal style sheet, so you can give external style sheets higher or lower priority than the internal one.
- ✓ The Style button in many element properties dialog boxes now includes an item in its drop-down menu to open the Class/ID dialog box directly.

Changing Size Units of Tables and Layers

When you resize a table or layer by dragging its border while holding down the Shift key, Nammo WebEditor now changes its size unit from pixels to percent, or vice versa.

Improved HTML Cleanup

Nammo WebEditor is now even better at cleaning up tags in documents imported from Microsoft Office.

Improved File Support

You can now open files in *.doc, *.xls, *.ppt, *.hwp, and *.gul formats directly from the Open dialog box.

Site Library

When no site is open, the Site Library panel now displays the file system of your computer, so you can open and insert documents and resource files more easily.

<PRE> tags

When you convert paragraphs to preformatted text (<pre>) elements, you can decide whether to convert each line to a separate <pre> element or convert the whole paragraph to a single <pre> with carriage returns between lines.

Default File Name Extension

You can choose the default extension for HTML documents as “.htm” or “.html”.

Syntax Highlighting

Namo WebEditor’s HTML mode now colors ASP, PHP, JSP, and JavaScript code as well as HTML.
